

**Full Sermon Transcript:**  
**False Prophet Brandon Biggs Exposed**  
October 4, 2025

Please help us to grow strong and deep anchors, that we not be shaken, that we not be moved away from the center of your will.

That we not be moved from your church, your people, your body, your kingdom, and your spirit.

May your will and your spirit prevail in this service today, in this message today, and we accept it, your anointing, your blessing, your presence in this and in each one of us, in Jesus' Holy Name, and the Church said, Amen. You may be seated.

Let's go to Matthew 24. We read this in the last sermon, and then lo and behold, the need to emphasize this point today. Demonic miracles, false prophets. Matthew 24, verse 24. Because false christs, false messiahs, and false prophets will arise and will show great signs, tremendous signs, huge signs, and wonders, so as to deceive.

If possible, even the elect, the chosen, even the true Church, even you, even me, that the devil would try to deceive us, to cause us to fall away from the center of God's will, fall away from the truth, fall away from God's Church, to be led astray by these false pastors, false churches, false denominations, false prophets, miracles, signs, and wonders that are worked by Satan.

Your typical average Church, unfortunately, do not warn their congregation, their members, of the severity and danger of demonic miracles and the power of Satan, and the power of false prophets.

They don't warn their congregation, their members, and Christians at large, that even Satan can work miracles.

Look at chapter 7, verse 21. We know this by heart. We can even quote it perfectly, word by word. Chapter 7, verse 21. We can quote all three verses perfectly. And in your name before many miracles, and then I would declare to them, or say to them, I never knew you, get away from me, you who work at breaking the law.

They work at breaking the Sabbath. They work at breaking the commandments, the first commandment, the second commandment, through the Trinity, through false images of Jesus on their wall, through crosses on their wall, through crosses hanging around their neck, which are Roman, pagan, Assyrian, Egyptian, pagan symbols, having nothing to do with Christ.

They work at these things. They actually teach people to break God's law, saying there is no law.

God's commandments are done away with, his Sabbaths are done away with, his biblical holy days are done away with.

They want to preach this, teach this. They work at breaking God's law. That's your average Sunday church. It's my duty to warn you about that.

This is in the Bible. It's my duty, my job, my responsibility to stand here, read the Bible, and repeat these verses over and over and over and over, that they may be engraved, carved, branded into your forehead, into your heart, into your mind, into your soul, that you may quote these verses perfectly to your family, to your friends, to people you witness to, that you know them in your heart in case your Bible is taken away from you by the authorities, that you not be led astray by your sister, by your brother, by your parents, by your children, by your co-workers, by your friends, by your aunt, by your uncle, by YouTube, by Google, that you not be led astray to believe the lies of the Sunday churches, the Trinity churches, the lawless churches, for Jesus says to them, specifically to them in this verse, get away from me. He doesn't say come here, I will teach you more. I will baby you, I will pacify you, I will give you more milk, but he says get away from me, I never knew you.

But these are Christians that go to church, they are pastors, they work miracles, they cast out demons, it's obvious that this is Christian pastors, obvious, they do it in the name of the Lord, they say I've done these in the name of the Lord. They're Christians, Christian leaders, evangelists, television evangelists, radio evangelists, traveling evangelists, church evangelists, they are popular, why would they not be popular?

If they are doing these things, common sense, use your brain for a few minutes. If they're casting out demons, if they're performing many miracles, it says in verse 22, the word many, not just a few, not just one, but multiple miracles, they're going to be famous, they're going to be popular, they're going to have hundreds of thousands of followers on YouTube, maybe even millions.

They're going to have the number one bestseller books, like Jonathan Cahn, that particular con artist. They're going to be famous, they're going to be invited into the different churches, movies to be made about them, they're popular because the world loves the lie.

The Bible says that the world will hate you, but yet they have hundreds of thousands of followers, millions of followers.

That's not being hated by the world. The more truth you have, the least followers that you will have, the least church members you will have, because you will be hated by everyone, not just a few, not just a few, but by the world, and the world means the majority, the greatest number of people on that planet, billions of people will hate you, not just a few, especially if you are a leader, especially if you are a leader, especially if you are a leader of the world, you will be hated by the world, especially if you are a leader, especially if you are in the prime light.

What's that word? I'm looking for a line light. Spotlight is a good one. If you're in the spotlight, in front of people, leading, you know, making the videos, if it is your ministry worldwide, you're getting the word out there all across the world, then it's going to be millions of people that will hate you, not just a few.

Going back to chapter 24 now, let's turn back, and in verse 24, chapter 24 and verse 24, great miracles.

Just because someone works a great miracle, or even a prophecy that comes true, does not automatically being instantly mean or prove that they are a true prophet of God, a true prophet of God, but a lot of people think that it does.

So today I'm going to expose a man on YouTube named Brandon Biggs.

Brandon Biggs has 573,000 followers on YouTube, almost 600,000 people. I'm sure that number is growing and will grow in the next few months.

I would not be surprised to see that number hit a million within the next few months.

He's famous, he's popular, primarily because he had a dream or vision of President Trump of a bullet glazing his ear before it happened.

And yes, that's amazing. And yes, that's amazing. But people assume just because he had a prophecy that came true, that it automatically means that he is definitely God's prophet.

But Brandon Biggs and other false prophets all across YouTube and churches, they never warn their people, their followers, that even Satan knows the future.

That would never come out of his mouth, ever, ever. Amen? Brandon Biggs will never, ever say those words that even Satan knows the future and even Satan can cast out demons and work mighty miracles.

He'll never say that. And your average church pastor would never say that because they are the ones described in Matthew 7, verses 21, 22, and 23.

They are the ones. Brandon Biggs teaches the fairy tale, false doctrine, of pre-tribulation rapture, and he emphasizes it continually, constantly, over and over and over.

That is his focus. Right there automatically disqualifies him. Amen? Right there.

Just that point all alone disqualifies him from being a true prophet or even a pastor of the Lord.

Automatically disqualifies him because that makes him extremely ignorant of biblical scripture, of basic altruism, scripture of basic elementary, basic scripture, extremely ignorant of the Bible.

How can he lead and teach and be a prophet of God when he himself is extremely ignorant of understanding the Bible?

The only way anybody can believe in a pre-tribulation rapture is only to be taught it by people.

You cannot just read and study the Bible and believe in it because the Bible very clearly teaches the direct opposite.

You have to be brainwashed and taught the pre-tribulation in order to believe in it.

You can't believe in it just from studying the Bible. You can't. Remember when Moses threw down his king, his staff onto the ground, it became a serpent, but also the Pharaoh's magicians did the exact same thing.

Even the devil can perform many of the same miracles. Brandon also believes and teaches in the building of a third temple, a third Jewish temple, which of course is absolutely not biblical.

The Bible, already in Matthew 24, is a list of things to watch for, for the signs of the end time and the great tribulation and the coming of the Lord, and yet it never ever mentions that the temple would be rebuilt.

But they would point to, where is it, somewhere around verse 15 or something, get my eyes where I can see here.

Yeah, verse 15, they would point to Matthew 24, verse 15. Therefore, when you see the abomination of desolation, which was spoken of through Daniel the prophet standing in the holy place, let the reader understand.

The holy place is the holy of holies, which is behind the veil, behind the curtain.

It is where the Ark of the Covenant is, and therefore they say that proves that a Jewish temple would be rebuilt before the tribulation.

How can you have the holy place without the temple as part of the temple? But when we read this carefully, actually slow down and actually think about what you're reading, instead of blowing past it real quickly, like people do, or talk to do, it doesn't actually say anything in this verse or previous verses or following verses, or parallel chapters, like Mark 13 and Luke 21, that are parallel gospels.

And none of these places do we actually find the Antichrist arises and builds the temple, or the nations agree to build the temple, or the Jews rebuild the temple.

Nothing like that, not even close, nothing close. So to believe that this is a rebuilding of the Jewish temple, you have to add to it, you have to add assumptions and teachings that it does not ever declare anywhere in the entire Bible.

You can have something to back up your teaching, not just assumptions and jumping to conclusions and then jump to another conclusion and another conclusion, all based upon a false assumption.

You've got to have something to back it up, and they don't.

So let's go over to 2 Thessalonians, chapter 2, and they would even point to this, even though this blows the pre-tribulation of rapture out of the water, it totally proves them wrong, and yet they will point to the fact that the Bible is not a false assumption, and yet they will point to this verse to try to prove themselves correctly when it proves them as ignorant and deceived.

It's pretty sad. 2 Thessalonians chapter 2, verse 4, talking about the Antichrist, who opposes and exalts himself above everyone called God or object of worship so that he would sit in the temple of Theos, the temple of God, exhibiting himself as being Theos, as being God, and therefore they say, there's the Antichrist in the temple that proves that the Jewish temple will be built.

Now, where is this temple? Again, to assume it's going to be on the Temple Mount or in Jerusalem or in Israel built by the Jews is assumption.

You've got to back it up. You've got to prove it, not assume it. You've got to prove it, not assume it. Meme. Amen.

So I will prove where this temple of God is located by giving you a Bible verse.

Let's keep a bookmark right there. We'll definitely come back to this chapter.

But Revelation 11, verse 19.

And the temple of God, which is in heaven, was opened in the Ark of the Covenant.

Where's the Ark of the Covenant? In the holy place. Come on now. Amen. So Scripture says the temple of God is in heaven. It doesn't say on earth. It doesn't say on the Temple Mount, Jerusalem or Israel. So they would say, but this is an entirely different chapter.

They would say that's a different context. The reality is, it's a Bible verse speaking about the The reality is, it's a Bible

verse speaking about the end times, talking about the temple of God and gives the location.

They cannot give me a verse that refers to a temple of God that gives the location as being on earth during the end times.

Now, the closest they could do is earlier in this chapter. Revelation 11, verse 1.

Then there was given to me a measuring rod like a staff. And someone said, rise and measure the temple of the God, the temple of God and the altar and those who worship in it.

Verse 2, leave out the courtyard, which is outside the temple and do not measure it, for it has been given to the Gentiles, and they would tread underfoot the holy city for 42 months.

So this does at first glance, if we glance by it quickly, don't stop, don't think, don't study it, don't examine it, then yes, it seems like the temple of God on earth in Jerusalem in the end times at first glance.

But notice in verse 1, that John is told to rise to measure the temple of God. That word, rise, in Greek can be used or translated to mean either of two different possibilities.

To rise in any situation, like rising up out of your seat, whatever, is one possible way of using that Greek word.

But also, it can also mean to rise from the dead, to be resurrected. It can be used either way.

So then context determines. The context will be what makes the decision of what it really means.

If it meant, John, just get out of your chair, or leave your house, get up out of bed, why would it even say it?

I mean, do you really, does an angel or God have to tell John, get out of bed, or leave your house, or get up out of your chair?

If it meant that, why doesn't it just say, go measure the temple? It would not need to say, get out of your bed to go to the temple, or get out of your chair to go to the temple.

It don't make sense why he is told to rise unless we consider the context of the chapter.

And the context of the chapter is the first resurrection. It is. It is the first resurrection. If you go back to chapter 9, chapter 10 verse 7, the seventh angel prepares to blow the trumpet.

That's the last trumpet. 1 Corinthians 15 verse 52 says, at the last trumpet, the dead in Christ will rise. Amen?

This is the last trumpet in chapter 10 verse 7. So when John is told to rise in chapter 11 verse 1, originally, there was no chapter divisions.

In the original scriptures, there was no separation between chapter 10 and chapter 11.

So this angel is about to blow that last trumpet in which the dead in Christ rise, and then John is told to rise.

Later in the same chapter, we see that verse 15, that trumpet does blow. We see that the two witnesses rise from the dead in verse 12.

Verse 12, come up here. That can also be translated as rise up here. So I'd like for the brothers to send me a note to see if we can translate that as rise up here.

I know come up here sounds better, but if it can correctly be translated as rise up here, I would like to do that, if that can be done correctly and accurately according to the Greek, so that we get the correlation with verse 1.

But we know that it is talking about them rising, whether we translate it as come up here or rise up here, or rise to come up here, or however we translate it, we know that it is talking about rising from the dead.

It is a resurrection. The resurrection of the saints that is described in 1 Thessalonians 4, which is also out of trumpet, and a great shout, the dead in Christ rise, and even the people that have survived the great tribulation, and it actually does say they have remained, which means survived, which also brothers send me a note.

1 Thessalonians 4, can we translate remain as survive? We have to look at the Greek.

If we can translate that as survive and do so accurately according to the Greek, that will help people understand better.

I will be careful about these things, but these are things I want to look at, dig into, because I want people to understand the scripture and translate it in a way that will wake people up from these lies and deceptions of false prophets like Brandon Biggs. Big fat liar. Amen.

So context of John being told to rise and measure the temple is him rising from the dead.

Context demands that it is talking about him rising in the resurrection. So the temple here is in heaven, part of it.

We know only part of it because there is also leave out the courtyard in chapter 11 verse 2, leave out the courtyard which is outside the temple and do not measure it for it is given to the Gentiles that they would tread underfoot the holy city Jerusalem for 42 months.

So that part, the courtyard, verse 2, is on earth during the tribulation. So this makes it very confusing, because people do not understand how the book of revelation works.

That the book of revelation goes back and forth in time. It will go up a little bit in time and then it will turn around and

go back in time to describe the events and then catch up with itself.

And it would do that back and forth, back and forth. You got to read this entire book of revelation to see that pattern. But once you see that pattern, then you know that is what it is doing. It is a pattern that it repeats over and over and over in the book of revelation.

That cannot be denied. That is fact. It does have that pattern. And that makes it confusing because God spoke in parables.

He spoke in ways. It is even symbolic. A lot of the things in the book of revelation are symbolic as well as being literal. Some things are both literal and symbolic. Some things are only literal. Some things are only symbolic. Things like this, parables and symbolism, things like this, is God's way of making for sure that only the wise will understand. And only those that are called will understand. And only those that seek and those that study and those that really want the truth will come to understand.

He does not want lazy fat slobs like Brandon Biggs in paradise. The Bible says there will be no dogs in paradise. We either shape up, stand up to the plate, put the nose to the grinder, do the work, or shut up.

You cannot have it both ways. But people want to be couch potato Christians, do nothing, do no work, have no works, have no commandments, have no law, have no requirements, have no high standards, and just make it in only by grace. Only by grace. And that's what they teach, that they will make it into heaven only by grace.

That's not biblical. It's not biblical at all. Brandon Biggs teaches the very foolish doctrine of all you got to do is ask God to come into your heart.

Repeat the words after me. A video that's literally less than two minutes long, repeat the words after me.

Here's how you get saved. Repeat these words after me. Invite the Lord into your heart. How gay! Amen.

Invite the Lord into your heart. Liberace could do that. It's ridiculous. The Bible says the soft will not inherit the kingdom.

His wife, in one of the videos, was all dressed in black. She wears cosmetics.

Why would a pastor's wife be wearing cosmetics? Why would she be all dressed in black unless she's going to a funeral?

He uses the Assyrian witchcraft name of Yeshua. Let's go to Revelation 13 verse 1. And the dragon stood on the sand of the seashore.

What seashore? The Mediterranean Sea by Common Sense. I know this is an assumption, but it's an educated assumption based on reality of facts.

Therefore, it's not an assumption if we based it upon facts that the Bible is a Middle Eastern book based upon nations throughout the entire Bible.

Throughout the entire Bible, you read about nations of Egypt, which borders the Mediterranean Sea, Israel, which borders the Mediterranean Sea, things like this, Turkey, which is the seven churches of Revelation.

We're all in Turkey. Why is modern day Turkey bordering the Mediterranean Sea? The sea is not the Baltic Sea. It's not the Atlantic Ocean.

It's not the Pacific Ocean. It's not the Indian Ocean. It's not the Antarctic. It's not an assumption.

It's based upon reality. It's based upon facts. It's based upon context of the entire Bible. It can be proven.

It can be proven from the Bible with a little bit of common sense, context. Amen?

Context is everything.

Brandon Biggs, he teases that the Antichrist would be from Afghanistan, that he saw the Antichrist flag of some group of Afghanistan.

His son made an image of this flag that he saw in some kind of a dream or vision that came from Seton.

And it's not even the true Afghanistan flag, but it's a flag of some group in northern Afghanistan, saying that the Antichrist will come from that.

And yet, Afghanistan does not border the Mediterranean Sea. The Mediterranean Sea. We also know that Isaiah 10 describes the Antichrist as being the Assyrian. It actually says Assyrian.

The Assyrian, the rod of my wrath. The Bible repeatedly calls the Antichrist the Assyrian, over and over.

In every one of the verses that I'm talking about, the context is undeniable. Absolutely undeniable.

I'm not exaggerating. The verses I'm talking about in the Bible that repeatedly refer to the end time Antichrist as the

Assyrian.

These are undeniable scriptures that the context is very easy to understand, very clear that it is talking about the final end time Antichrist, and it repeatedly calls him the Assyrian.

Not the Afghan, but the Assyrian. The nation on earth that has the most Assyrian people is Syria.

Assyria. Syria. The president of Syria would be the king of Assyria. This is common sense.

Even a child could figure that out. Even a child. The Revelation, chapter 13 verse 1, we see the Antichrist figure, satanic figure, at the Mediterranean Sea.

I saw evil beasts talking about the Antichrist coming up out of that sea, coming up out of that region of the Middle East, bordering, and having the ten horns, and the seven heads, and on his horns ten crowns, and on his heads, blasphemous names.

Now the blasphemous names, what are those? Well, if it's in that region of the world, would it be Russian names?

Would it be American? Would it be English? Would it be Spanish? Let's use some common sense.

What language would it be? That word, evil beast, if you wish to read that in Arabic, which is the number one language of that region around the Mediterranean Sea in every direction.

Arabic is the number one language in that region. When you read this in Arabic, this exact verse in Arabic where it now says evil beast or beast in our English Bibles, it is Assad's true surname, original surname, before his grandfather changed the family surname.

It is his original family name. So Arabic and names, names, you've got a name right here in this verse.

Assad himself is a blasphemous name. It is a blasphemous name. You know what? Because they're going to be saying all around the world in the name of Assad. Amen?

They're going to be saying that in the name of Assad, just like we say in the name of Jesus.

They're going to be saying in the name of Assad, we do this, we declare this, they will finish their prayers as in the name of Assad.

But it's not one name. Notice there's an S on that. It's multiple names. It's not just one name that is blasphemous.

We've got to compare this to chapter 14 verse 1. Remember originally there was no chapter divisions between these different chapters.

They were all just one book without any chapters originally. Chapter 14 verse 1, which is listed just before chapter 14.

There's a reason for this. This is not a mistake. This is not a typo. Verse 1 is listed as the last verse of chapter 13.

And I have it in that particular format because they put the chapter divisions in the wrong place when they invented these chapter divisions.

They put the chapter divisions in the wrong place because verse 1 really belongs with that previous chapter because of context.

When you make a chapter division, when you're writing a book, you make your chapter divisions where you have concluded a certain topic.

Right? You conclude a certain topic. Right? You conclude your topic or your point that you're making.

Then you conclude your chapter so that in the next chapter you begin a new point.

So this verse 1 actually belongs as the last sentence of chapter 13. But that verse says, it says, and I looked and behold the Lamb Christ standing on Mount Zion and with him 144,000, those were the male virgin Israelites, having his name, Jesus's name, even the same name as the Father written on their foreheads. Amen?

On the forehead. Look at chapter 13 again, verse 1. Where do you think these names are going to be?

On their head, the crowns, but also the name. Is it going to be on their thigh, on their back, on their arms, on their triceps?

It's on their foreheads. Amen? So why do you have chapter 13, verse 1 and chapter 14, verse 1, as being talking about the names?

So if chapter 14, verse 1 is the name of the true God, then why wouldn't chapter 13, verse 1 be the name of the false God, Assad as being a name of a false God, which actually gives you in that verse an Arabic, that being more than one name of false gods, and Yahshua is a name of false gods, Assyrian, Arabic, Assyrian, knowing that this is an Assyrian beast, according to Isaiah 10, that this is an Assyrian Antichrist, as the Bible tells us, not Afghani, not Roman, not German, not English, not Jordan, not Turkish, not Russian, not American, not British, not Irish, not Scottish, not African, but very specifically, the Bible says Assyrian.

And even in Daniel 11 or Daniel 12, in the Old Greek, I believe it says Assyrian.

I might have to double check that, but that's a possibility. But these are things that are hidden, like a parable hides

things on purpose, so that only the people that are willing to dig, do the work, work at it, to figure it out, to put the pieces of the puzzle together, to use their brains, would discover these things.

It's like a Bible code, but it's a Bible code that you don't need a computer to figure out, that isn't hidden in mysterious numbers or witchcraft gematria, but rather, it is in plain sight.

These things are in plain sight, but people can't see it, because they want to be a couch potato Christian, have everything just spoon-fed to them, like a baby.

They don't want to read the entire article. They don't want to look at the Greek and the Hebrew, Assyrian, and Arabic words.

That's too much trouble, because they've got a football game to get to. So, Brandon Biggs, he uses the witchcraft Assyrian name of false gods, he uses the blasphemous names of false gods, which breaks the first commandment. He believes in a secret rapture fairy tale, which means that he has videos where people are riding a bus, and they're there, but then in one second, snap of a finger, they're gone instantly.

Instead of them flying up into the air, like the Bible describes, the Bible never ever describes the saints or the church just vanishing in thin air.

They don't describe it like that. The Bible describes the saints rising up into the air.

His prophecies, his videos, are not based upon scripture at all, but upon a fairy tale.

We'll go to 1st Corinthians 15 verse 51. Behold, I tell you a mystery. We will not all sleep, or pass away in this life, that we will all be changed in a moment, in the twinkle of an eye, at the last trumpet.

For this perishable must put on the imperishable, and this mortal must put on the immortality. Amen.

This is talking about the resurrection. Amen. At the last trumpet, that seventh trumpet, although I didn't read this part, we need to move.

Probably we'll do something to help us to see this. Yeah, let's move, brothers, send me a note.

Let's move these, all this inserted footnote to the end of that verse. Make it easier.

Verse 52. In a moment, in the twinkle, twinkling of the eye, at the last trumpet, for the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. Amen.

So they try to use this verse. Brandon Biggs himself and all these rapture fairy tale idiots, they use this verse to say that the saints would just vanish instantly because they'll be here one moment, but in a twinkle of the eye is the same as a snap of a finger, the twinkle of the eye.

It's just a millisecond, less than a second. That's where they get that from. But notice that they're going to rise. This verse says that they're going to rise.

This verse does not say the very verse that they get it from proves them wrong. The exact verse that they use to teach they'll be gone in one second actually proves them wrong when they have those videos and movies of them just disappearing, when this verse says that they're going to rise up into the air.

Their theology is not based upon accurate understanding of the Bible. So how can he be a true prophet?

Just because he had a dream or vision that came true about Trump's ear being being slightly hit by a bullet, it doesn't prove anything except for he's being influenced by a spirit of some kind.

That's the only thing that proves. He's being influenced by a spirit of some kind.

Then you have to ask yourself, is it Satan or is it God? It's not automatically God just because somebody has a true prophecy or a miracle.

We know from Mark 16 that the true church, true Christians and true pastors and true prophets, that we must have miracles.

We must have miracles. But just because we have a miracle all by itself doesn't prove that we are from God because even Satan has miracles as we read in Matthew 7 and as we read in Matthew 24 and as we read in Revelation 13.

Even Satan has miracles. So miracles and fulfilled prophecies all by itself is not enough to prove that somebody is from God because it could be Satan.

The churches and pastors like Brandon Biggs, they never say this. He has tons of videos and yet not one of his videos does he say this because he's guilty of it.

I did a search on his videos looking for the word Sabbath. Not one video. Not one. Zero.

Not one video teaching the requirement of God's holy Sabbath which is one of the Ten Commandments.

How can you not teach that? How ignorant can you be of scripture? It's one of the Big Ten. It's one of the Ten Commandments.

It's one of the Ten Commandments. It's one of the Ten Commandments. How can you not teach it? Oh, but just ask Jesus into your heart.

It's soft homo theology. That's what that is.

In one of his videos, his wife reads what he has written about a dream or a vision that he has and she quotes him as saying that no one is allowed to die on the day of the rapture.

That no one is allowed to die on the day of the rapture. Let's look at Revelation 11:19. That's the last verse of chapter 11.

And the temple of God which is in heaven was opened and the ark of his covenant appeared in his temple and there was flashes of lightning and sounds and peals of thunder and an earthquake and a great hail storm.

If there's an earthquake, it's not a 2.3. It's not a 2.5. It's not going to be a 3.0. It's going to be big even though it doesn't say in this particular verse.

It's common sense. It's a biblical earthquake. It's an earthquake predicted by the Holy Bible. It's not going to be a little one.

And a great hail storm. This ain't going to be pea-sized hail. This is biblical hail. Biblical hail is usually like baseball or basketball.

If you're going to have an earthquake which we know ain't no little tiny thing and you're going to have great giant hail stones probably baseball or basketball size, why would no one die on the entire earth?

Why would no one die? Amen. This also begins the wrath of God too. Amen. Why would no one die on earth on the day that the saints are called up? Where does the Bible say?

Where does the Bible say that on the day that the church is crucified and called up, that no one on earth is allowed to die that day?

You think of there's a chapter in Revelation, it might be chapter 9 perhaps, where it says for five months no one is allowed to die.

And yet that's not even the same month as the church being called up. So there is a time frame in which no one would be allowed to die.

Even Isaiah 65 that everybody is to be a hundred years. They're not dying if everybody is living to be a hundred.

So anytime in the Bible where there is that special occasion where nobody is allowed to die, it does indicate it in some way shape or form.

And yet we cannot find that about the day that the church is called up. There's no verse in the entire Bible to indicate in a new way, shape or form, that that day will be a day where death is not allowed.

If you can't prove it not even from common sense, not even from context, not even from history, you can't prove it in any way, shape or form.

Why do you just believe somebody? Just blindly believe. It doesn't match Scripture. Things like that would be significant enough for Scripture to actually say it.

That would be significant.

He teaches the insane doctrine, I mean it's insane doctrine, that people that on the day of the rapture, it would be claimed on the news and it would be claimed by people worldwide that these Christians were taken away by aliens. This man has got a few screws loose. He needs brain surgery bad. And yet, almost 600,000 people idolize this guy, worship this guy. It is the cult of Brandon Biggs, which breaks the first commandment to have no other gods.

Alien, a fake alien invasion. Why does the Bible never say that? You know, there's a lot of people teaching that, a lot of people. There's people all over this world that are having dreams and visions of the rapture than it says on the news in their dream.

They're seeing the news on TV or they're listening to the radio in the dream and the news comes on and says aliens have abducted all the Christians.

Why would aliens abduct only Christians? Ain't that stupid? This is stupid stuff and people actually believe it. And people all over the world are having these dreams.

That don't mean it's God. Satan deceives the whole earth. Revelation 12 verse 9. Satan deceives the entire earth just because a million people have the same dream don't mean it's from God.

Satan deceives the entire earth. The whole world is going to worship the Antichrist.

The majority of which is living in that first few months, they will worship the Antichrist.

But this is insane theology and you would have to be stupid as hell to believe in this guy.

He teaches that every Christian should be praying in tongues. The Bible don't teach that. There's only one verse that says pray in the spirit but it doesn't say pray in tongues. That's not what that verse is teaching. You can pray in the spirit without praying in tongues. It has nothing to do with tongues. If it had something to do with tongues it would say it.

He has absolutely zero videos teaching the biblical commandment of keeping the Passover communion. In the book of John is it chapter three or chapter four or chapter six? Verse what? Verse 53. John 6:53 that says that if you do not eat my body, eat my flesh, drink my blood, which is the Passover communion, symbolically if you do not do this you have no life in yourself. That means you're not saved. If you do not take Passover communion, this is what the Bible teaches, you are not saved. You're not saved unless you take the Passover communion after you're baptized. He has absolutely zero videos teaching the requirement of baptism despite Acts 2:38, despite Mark 16:16, despite John 3 and no Passover commandment in any of his videos, despite John 6:53 and 1 Corinthians 11.

Nothing about the Feast of Tabernacles despite Zechariah 14. Nothing!

All of his doctrine is based upon demonic dreams, demonic visitations, visitations from demons that he calls Jesus and Yahshua. He's being visited by demons. He says he sees Jesus over and over and over. You know what John said when he saw Jesus? When he saw Jesus, Jesus' eyes were like a flame of fire. Amen? When Ezekiel saw Jesus, there was fire present. Why every time that Brandon sees Jesus, there's no fire, no thunder, no earthquake, no rainbow, nothing majestic about him. Looks just like a normal human being with long hair, with white robe. That's the Roman image of Jesus. That's the pagan image of Jesus. That's Satan. The biblical image of Jesus when people are visited by Jesus is majestic. Fire in his eyes and so forth. Amen? When they go blind like Paul did, when before he was at that point. Moses saw a burning bush. Amen? All these people that say they see Jesus and yet their description of Jesus is like a normal human being instead of a biblical description of the people that see Jesus. Amen? The brain can do a lot of tricks and the devil can do a lot of tricks. You combine those things together, religious brainwashing, the mind doing tricks, demon tricks, demonic tricks, false visions, false dreams, false doctrine.

You combine all these things and you're in and out with Brandon Biggs and other false prophets such as John Hagge. Another major false prophet with millions of audience worldwide. He's very big on that pre-trib rapture fairy tale. As I said, he claims that Antichrist would come from Afghanistan which is not biblical. He'll be proven wrong about that pretty soon which will prove him as a false prophet. Is my duty, as a true prophet of God, to expose him? I don't have time to expose every false prophet, every false pastor, every false church, so please don't encourage me to do that. Don't start sending me a list or telling me I need to do this. I ain't got time to fool with every false church, every false pastor, every false prophet, because that's the whole world. I ain't got time to do that, but this particular one I felt like that I needed to speak about him, expose him. I'm led by God. I'm led by God. I'm led by God. I'm led by God. I'm led by God. I'm led by God. But what I do, what I preach, we see that over and over in these sermons. So let God lead me about who to expose. I don't have time to expose everybody, but it is my duty to expose some of them, some of the false prophets. It is my duty to do that. It's much more my duty than yours as the leader and as a true prophet of the Lord, and I'm not trying to exalt myself when I say that, but if you are put in charge of something, you have to claim it. If you're a manager of a store, a business, a restaurant, whatever it may be, if you're a manager of something and you don't say, hey, I'm the manager of this business, then how can you manage it if you don't say that? You have to claim your title. You have to claim your authority. Every Christian has to claim their authority. Every true Christian must claim their authority, whether it's a little bit of authority or a great authority, whether you're in that administration rank of, as the Bible says, chiefly the apostles than the prophets. The apostles, the prophets, I'm kind of losing my head right now. Evangelists. Yeah, evangelists, pastors, and teachers. So, or rather, you are a lay member, a member that is not within the administration.

You still have some authority of God and some level. Every one of us must claim the level of authority that God has given us, whatever that level might be.

And if you don't claim it, then you're not in the center of God's will. If I don't claim who I am in Christ and the authority he has given me, then I'm disappointing God and not doing my job.

I can't do my job unless I claim the authority that he's given me. Why was Brandon Biggs given the dream or vision of Trump's ear?

Why? I can't say for sure whether it was God that gave it to him or Satan that gave it to him.

I know he's been visited by demons. But it's possible that God may have given him that dream or vision because 2 Thessalonians 2 says that God himself will send the delusion, the strong delusion, the deception of the Antichrist.

Right? Let's go back to 2 Thessalonians chapter 2 again. We should know this already without turning it, but I'll prove it, what it says. 2 Thessalonians 2 verse 10. And with all the deception of wickedness for those who perished, because they did not receive the love of the truth, so as to be saved.

For this reason, or because of this, Theos will send upon them, God will, Jesus will send upon them, a lie, a strong deception, so that they will believe a lie.

Verse 12, in order that they all may be judged who did not believe the truth, but took pleasure in wickedness.

They're taking pleasure in false prophets, they're taking pleasure in the doctrines that tickle their ears, such as the pre-tribulation rapture fairy tale, which tickles their ears, makes them feel good.

God himself will send that lie, God will, because God is hearing people's prayers, all these billion people praying for the day of the secret rapture.

If they're praying to be eaten by birds, which is exactly what they're praying for, God will allow the birds to eat them.

As the Bible says in the book of Revelation, that the flesh of the people will be eaten by the birds, even as Luke 17 talks about that.

If they want a Yahshua, Assyrian, Arabic God, then God would give them what they're praying for.

What they're preaching, what they're prophesying. God will make their prophecies come true.

Hello. God will make the prophecies of the false prophets come true. Meme. Because that's what the people want.

That's what the people ask for. That's what the people preach, teach, ask for, and pray for.

So God will make it come true that it won't be Jesus splitting the skies. It will be the Antichrist.

End of Meme. The Bible says that God turns them over to their desires. Amen. Book of Romans.

God turns them over to their desires. They desire to serve the God of the rapture.

They desire, they wait for, they sit out on their porch and they look in the eastern sky and say, oh, Jesus could split that sky today.

I can't wait for that happen. I'm ready to go. Oh. One of these days it'll happen, but it won't be Jesus.

It'll be the Antichrist that they're praying for. Their messiah, the malady, the Islamic malady that they're praying for, will be given to them.

They ask for the lie. They get the lie that they want. They follow these false prophets because they love a lie. So God will give it to them what they won't, handing them over to their own desires.

They'll get what they ask for. They'll get what they deserve. Jesus will slap them in the face and whip their ass. It's coming and it's coming soon.

The great tribulation, one of these days is going to happen. Perhaps in the spring of 2006, perhaps is very likely to happen at that time.

But whenever it happens, people like Brandon Biggs and John Hagge and all these multiple other millions of false prophets that are teaching the pre-tribulation rapture, they will be proven wrong on that very day.

When they themselves would die from nuclear war, they themselves would die from famine, disease, starvation.

They themselves would be put into concentration camps and chains. They themselves would look like the Jewish holocaust, Brandon Biggs.

You're going to lose a lot of weight if you survive that long. The judgment of God is coming to these Christmas of God is coming to these Christmas, Easter, Trinity, Ash Wednesday, Holy Ghost, tongue speaking hypocrites.

The judgment of God is coming to Brandon Biggs, John Hagge, and all the Billy Graham worshipers.

Billy Graham was from Satan. Stop idolizing him. He was not a man of God at all. He taught that Muslims don't even need to accept Jesus.

That's what Billy Graham said. He said Muslims don't need to accept Jesus. That they already serve God. He was from

Satan.

He was a number one bestseller. A man of God will never ever ever be not even close to a number one bestseller because the world loves the lie and hates the truth.

If you want a true prophet of God, find the one on YouTube that has the least number of followers, then you might be close.

Whether it was God or Satan that gave Brandon that dream or vision, whether it was God or Satan that gave it to him, the purpose is to give the people the deception that they so intensely crave and ask for and tickles their ears.

It is to cause people to be even more stubborn, even more rebellious. This is the purpose.

To cause the people that hate the truth, even as God hardened the heart of Pharaoh, the people that hate God's people, the people who hate God, the people who hate Jesus, people who hate what the Bible really teaches, that their hearts be even more hardened because that's what they deserve.

Their heart is already hard. Their heart and their mind, their brains, are already classified, already hard.

God will bring upon them the intensification of what they already are in their souls, dark souls, very dark souls, deserving to be eaten by the raptured birds of Luke 17.

Very deserving. It was just the other day that I had mentioned about to not be deceived by demonic miracles and false prophets.

I had no idea at the time that today's message would be exposing one in which could threaten people to fall away.

We must be careful who we believe, what we believe. Test everything by Scripture, not your discernment, because your discernment is crap.

I've never met anyone in my life that had good discernment, ever. Don't trust your heart, your discernment.

What does the Bible say? What does the Bible say? Amen. I would bet people would have good discernment.

I encourage people to beg God for good discernment. It's a necessary thing to gain.

I just don't know many people have ever met many people that had it. I would have to take my words back.

I've met a few people that had good discernment. I have. I have met a few people, a handful of people, that had good discernment. There are a few, but in this world where Satan has deceived the entire world, if they had good discernment, they wouldn't be deceived.

If the entire world has been deceived, how can they claim to have good discernment?

And yet, every one of them will claim, guarantee you that, all of the lost people will claim to have good discernment.

The people in Matthew 7 who are evangelists and prophets that do mighty miracles, Christian leaders, guarantee you every one of them think they have good discernment.

We need good discernment. We should ask for it. Beg for it. Seek it as if your life depended on it.

It's just not common.
